Dear Mr. Smith:

The Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) strongly supports the continued collection of data by the Census Bureau's State and Local Government Finances surveys. The data collected are crucial to key components of BEA's economic statistics. Government Finances is a multi-instrument survey system that collects a database of financial information for the 50 states and for all types of local governments. The survey forms used are:

- F-5, Annual Survey of State Government Tax Collections
- F-11, Locally-Administered Defined Benefit Plans
- F-12. State-Administered Defined Benefit Plans
- F-13, Finances of Insurance Trust Systems
- F-25, State Agencies
- F-28, County, Municipal, and Township
- F-29, Multi-Function Special Agencies
- F-32, Special Agencies
- F-42, School Building Agencies

BEA uses the information from these surveys to prepare the national income and product (NIPA) and regional accounts. More specifically, the data obtained through these forms are essential to BEA for maintaining reliable estimates of state and local government finances in the NIPAs. State and local governments currently account for about 11% of GDP, and the Government Finances data constitute the only systematic collection of financial data from which NIPA estimates and regional accounts can be constructed. The following table describes the items used from the various forms for the survey.

The Federal Register notice makes reference to modifying the existing questions concerning actuarial funding of public pension plans for state-administered plans and adding these questions to the survey for locally administered plans. Please continue to inform BEA about any proposed modifications to these forms, before the forms' final approval, as the Government Finances series of surveys plays a critical role in BEA's local state and government sector.
