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# I-589, Application For Asylum And For Withholding Of Removal

This online form is used to apply for asylum and for withholding of removal.

△ Only certain applicants may apply for asylum online with USCIS at this time. Failure to follow applicable instructions may result in rejection of your online application and/or a filing delay. # Before You Start Your Application

# Eligibility

You may apply for asylum if you:

 Submit an application for asylum within 1 year of arriving in the United States, unless you can establish that there are changed circumstances that materially affect your eligibility for asylum or extraordinary circumstances directly related to your failure to

Failure to file the Form I-589 within 1 year of your last arrival in the United States may also delay your eligibility for employment authorization or result in the denial of your application for employment authorization.

Simply filing an application for asylum does not entitle you to employment authorization or to work in the United States

You may include in your asylum application your spouse and/or any children who are under 21 years of age and unmarried, if they are in the United States.

You are not eligible to apply for asylum with USCIS if you previously applied and were denied by an immigration judge (unless you can show that circumstances have changed which affect your eligibility for asylum)

# Additional information

### Right to legal representation:

Immigration law is complex. You have the option of hiring a legal representative—at your own expense—for your asylum interview or Immigration Court proceedings.

For help completing this form and preparing your evidence, there are attorneys and voluntary agencies available for no fee or a reduced fee. Please refer to this <u>list</u>.

# Employment authorization:

You can only ask for employment authorization (permission to work in the United States) if your asylum application is still pending 365 days after it was filed with USCIS. If your asylum application is denied before the 365-day period has passed, you will not be granted employment authorization.

You can submit an application for a work permit by filing a Form I-765, <u>Application for Employment Authorization</u>. Carefully follow the instructions and submit the form with proof that you have a pending asylum application.

Each family member included in your application who wants permission to work must submit a separate Form I-765.

If you are granted asylum, you will be allowed to work in the United States and do not have to apply for employment authorization. You can apply for an Employment Authorization Document (work permit) if you want evidence that you are allowed to work in the United States as a result of being granted asylum.

# Asylum Process

# File the I-589

When you submit your Form I-589 and evidence online, you will immediately receive a receipt notice. You will be able to track your case and see all USCIS notices in your account. We will notify you by email and/or text message with any updates.

# Attend your biometric services appointment

After submitting your application, you will receive a biometric services appointment notice. At the appointment, you will provide your fingerprints, photograph, and signature so that USCIS can verify your identity and conduct background and security checks, including a check of criminal history records maintained by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), before making a decision on your application.

# ☑ Attend your interview

After submitting your application, you will receive a notice for your asylum interview.

If you do not speak English fluently, you must bring an interpreter with you to your interview. Your interpreter must be at least 18 years of age and be fluent in English and your language.

# ☑ Receive your asylum decision

At the end of your asylum interview, we will let you know how you will receive the decision in your case.

# Evidence

As part of applying for asylum, you must provide evidence to support your application. These documents help us determine if you are eligible for asylum and verify your answers.

Do not send us original documents in the mail. Provide legible copies of your documents unless we later ask for original documents.

You may amend or supplement your application before or at the time of your asylum interview with an asylum officer and at your hearing in Immigration. For asylum applications filled with USCIS, submit any documentary evidence at least 14 calendar days before your interview with an asylum office. Any document containing foreign language submitted to USCIS must be accompanied by a full English language translation that the translator has certified as complete and accurate, and by the translator's certification that he or she is competent to translate from the foreign language

# Required documents

# Dependent identification

For each family member you are including in your application as a dependent (spouse or children), you must upload proof of their identity and your relation to them. For all other family members, uploading identity documents is optional.

# Documents you may provide

The other documents you may need to submit will depend on the information you enter in the application. The online form will automatically determine the other documents

# Personal identification

Upload a copy of each page (cover to cover) of your passport, other travel documents, and any U.S. immigration documents.

We recommend you upload other identification if you have it, such as a birth certificate, military or national identification card, or driver's license. You may be asked to bring the originals of your and your family's identification documents to the interview.

## Family identification

Upload documents that prove the identity of each family member you are not including as a dependent and your relationship to them.

- Proof of identity may include a copy (every page) of each relative's passport, other travel documents, and any U.S. immigration documents.
- Evidence of relationship may include birth records of your children, marriage certificate, or proof of termination of marriage, for each relative.

If you do not have (and cannot get) personal or family identification, you must try to provide other kinds of evidence such as medical, religious, and school records. We call this "secondary evidence."

You may also submit an affidavit from at least one person for each event you are trying to prove. Affidavits may be provided by relatives or others. Persons providing affidavits need not be U.S. citizens or lawful permanent residents.

# Cover letter

You may upload a cover letter to provide a summary of your application.

If you were previously included in a spouse's or parent's pending application but you are no longer eligible to be included as a derivative applicant, you must include a cover letter referencing the previous application and explaining that you are now independently filing for asylum.

# Written statement

Your written statement should include events, dates, and details of your experiences that relate to your claim for asylum.

## Specific claim of eligibility

Upload evidence showing the specific facts that support your claim.

- Evidence may include newspaper articles, affidavits of witnesses or experts, medical and/or psychological records, doctors' statements, periodicals, journals, books, photographs, official documents, or personal statements or live testimony from witnesses or experts.
- . You may also upload an affidavit (statement or letter) from at least one person for each event you are trying to prove. Affidavits may be provided by relatives or others. Persons providing affidavits need not be U.S. citizens or lawful permanent residents.
- . If you have difficulty discussing harm you have suffered in the past, you may wish to submit a health professional's report explaining this difficulty.
- If evidence supporting your claim is not reasonably available or you are not providing such corroboration at this time, you must explain why and upload this explanation.

# General country conditions

You may upload reasonably available corroborative evidence showing the general conditions in the country from which you are seeking asylum.

# Criminal History

Aliens who have been convicted of a particularly serious crime are not eligible for asylum. For applications filed on or after April 1, 1997, the conviction may have occurred either inside or outside of the United States. If you have been arrested in the United States you must submit a certified copy of all arrest reports, court dispositions, sentencing documents, and any other relevant documents. You must be prepared to provide the original upon request. If they are not available, upload an explanation of why documents are not available.

We may grant extensions to submit additional evidence on a discretionary basis. We will treat these extensions as an applicant-caused delay when adjudicating your asylum application. Any applicant-caused delay will result in us denying your application for employment authorization if the delay is unresolved when you file for employment

If you are presenting evidence during your interview, you must provide two copies of each document. If a document is in a foreign language, you must provide a full English translation of it and a translator's certification. You may also present other document types, including audio and video tapes, during your interview.
