

Application For Naturalization



The Application for Naturalization is used to become a U.S. citizen through naturalization, which is the process you take to voluntarily become a U.S. citizen if you were born outside of the United States.

In general, you may be eligible if you can show continuous U.S. residence for three or five years, are at least 18 years old, and demonstrate good moral character and loyalty to the U.S. Constitution. You must also take the English and civics test, unless you qualify for an English language exemption or a medical disability exception.

Before You Start Your Application

■ Eligibility

You will need to select your basis for eligibility after you start your application.

Fee

We will automatically calculate the cost for you before you submit your application. See Form G-1055, available at www.uscis.gov/g-1055, for specific information about the fees applicable to this form.

There is no filing fee if you are a member or veteran of any branch of the U.S. Armed Forces filing on your own behalf.

Refund Policy

USCIS does not refund fees, regardless of any action we take on your application, petition, or request, or how long USCIS takes to reach a decision. By continuing this transaction, you acknowledge that you must submit fees in the exact amount and that you are paying the fees for a government service.

Filing online

Submitting your application online is the same as mailing in a completed paper form. They both gather the same information and cost the same.

Track your case status online
