To provide U.S. citizens with the resources and encouragement needed to acquire skills and experiences in areas of the world critical to the future security of nations in exchange for a commitment to seek work in the Federal Government. This will enable the National Security Education Program (NSEP) to select qualified applicants to be awarded Boren Scholarships, Boren Fellowships, and English for Heritage Language Speakers program Scholarships.

A record is maintained in the system, NSEPnet, for each student who receives an award. The progress that each student makes toward fulfilling their federal service obligation is tracked within this system."

Disclosures pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552a(b)(12) may be made from this system to consumer reporting agencies as defined in the Fair Credit Reporting Act (14 U.S.C. 1681a(f)) or the Federal Claims Collection Act of 1966 (31 U.S.C. 3701(a)(3)). The purpose of this disclosure is to aid in the collection of outstanding debts owed to the Federal Government, typically to provide an incentive for debtors to repay delinquent Federal Government debts by making these debts part of their credit records.

PRIVACY RISKS (Collection, Use, and Sharing): Access, storage and transmission of information protected under the Privacy Act of 1974 are subject to threats, including, but not limited to: malware, sniffing, spoofing, and physical assault, as well as various natural disasters and failures which impact either the protected infrastructure or the services upon which the infrastructure depends. All of these imperil, to one extent or another, information availability, integrity, and confidentiality.

The security features of the NSEP Scholar and Fellow Support System provide a level of protection that meets or exceeds the minimal requirements of DoD Directives 5400.11 and 8500.01E. The concept of identification and authentication "layered protection" is used to keep unauthorized users out of the NSEP Scholar and Fellow Support System.

In order to establish layered protection of information, paper and electronic media containing information is

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restricted to those who require the data in the performance of their official duties. Access to information is further restricted by the use of passwords that are changed every 180 days. Physical entry is restricted by the use of locks, guards, and administrative procedures. PII is encrypted when transmitted electronically. Contract officers are required to incorporate all appropriate Privacy Act clauses and contractor personnel are required to sign non-disclosure documents holding them to all provisions of the Privacy Act.
