

Q: Why do I need a permit? A: Smoke from open burning is an air pollutant with effects on air quality and public health (especially for children and the elderly).

Q: What are some alternatives to outdoor burning?

A: Chipping and shredding vegetation for composting. Also household items such as glass, plastics and paper can be recycled and should not be burned.

Q: How can I burn more cleanly? A: Make sure your fuel is as dry as possible, separate the fire from the damp ground and be sure there is a draft to keep the fire burning hot.

Q: Are there exceptions? A: Cultural, traditional and recreational fires are exempt and do not require a permit.
