After reviewing the information provided in the supplementary information section of proposed extension page found at the link at the end of this comment, I believe that the required paperwork is important in insuring students aged between 14 and 16 are not taken advantage of by employers and in insuring their schooling is not materially impacted by their employment. Given the reality that many low-income students are not necessarily aware when their employment interferes with their schooling (and to a lesser extent health), it is important for the government to oversee the process and protect students. By having teacher-coordinator, employer, and student sign an agreement, it is less likely that the employer takes advantage of the student with a teacher-coordinator intermediary.
