Agencies, including USAID, or that a Department or Agency is proposing, completing, or withdrawing. The Agenda is intended to facilitate comments and views by interested members of the public. Publication of the proposed rulemaking actions in the Agenda does not impose any obligation on USAID to take any final action with regard to any specific item. Furthermore, USAID is not precluded from rulemaking activities not listed in this Agenda.

On July 19, 2023, the Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs published guidance on Broadening Public Participation and Community Engagement in the Regulatory Process. USAID fully supports this effort by having a robust outreach program with partners, including recurring Industry Days and outreach events, use of social media to reach wide audiences, and the WorkwithUSAID.org platform. Additionally, USAID engages stakeholders when developing new development policies or strategies.
