## To Whom It May Concern:

The Wyoming Game and Fish Department (Department) has reviewed the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) Proposed Rule [Docket No. FWS–HQ–MB–2019–0103] and Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) concerning Management of Conflicts Associated With Double-crested Cormorants (*Phalacrocorax auritus*; cormorant) throughout the United States. We offer the following comments for your consideration.

The Department supports the proposed EIS and adoption of preferred Alternative A for addressing cormorant depredation concerns. Although cormorant depredation is not currently an issue within Wyoming, cormorants could pose significant mortality to state fisheries resources requiring additional population management. The Department supports the establishment of a new permit option that will afford additional state oversight in cormorant management. Although Wyoming supports preferred Alternative A, we additionally advocate for an Aquatic Depredation Order providing administrative relief and control of cormorant where needed. Re-issuance of an Aquaculture Depredation Order to include western populations would provide administrative relief and additional ability to control cormorants, when necessary, at aquaculture facilities. By allowing flexibility and having multiple options available, the Department would be able to adequately address cormorant depredation issues should they arise. The Department supports the monitoring process outlined within the EIS, ensuring cormorant take across political boundaries will be commensurate with population status.
