I have a comment on form I-130 Part 5 items 7 and 9, labeled "Relationship" for Relatives 1 and 2. The text above Relative 1 says, "If you are also submitting separate petitions for other relatives, provide the names of and your relationship to each relative." The phrase "your relationship to each relative" is confusing about the direction of the relationship. For example, if you were submitting a separate petition for your parent, then, taken literally, it might seem that "your relationship to each relative" would be "child", not "parent", since you are a child to that relative (your parent). But an applicant might put "parent" in that case, because that is the direction that relationships are usually asked about, e.g. in Part 1 item 1 which says "I am filing this petition for my" which clearly means the relative's relationship from the your perspective. Can you re-write the text to clarify the direction of relationship that should be entered?
