This is to express that I do not agree with the proposed change to the confidentiality terms as expressed in the proposed SBA Form 641 because:

- The information request in section 11 of the form 641 is confusing. Will I be agreeing to surveys and will I also be solicited for services I don't want? I don't feel it is appropriate to ask somebody this in order to get help through the SBA. If this is something your agency wants to do please do so through a second, separate, optional form
- I fail to see what purpose, if any, is served by soliciting a small business for other services. This feels like a corporatization or privatization of a government entity that functions amazingly well as is. I'm not comfortable with where this is headed.
- The information collection requires a small business to "waive all claims", why if they are protecting my information? Does not give me any reassurance of confidentiality and trust. I enjoy a good working relationship with my SBDC and don't want to be solicited by SBA or its agents. This feels like it's possible an agent may now be acting out of self interest to recommend services they have an interest in and that if I find out then I wouldn't be able to do anything about this.
