The Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) strongly supports the continued collection of data by the Census Bureau for the Quarterly Services Survey (QSS). The data collected on these forms are crucial to key components of BEA's economic statistics.

BEA uses data from these forms to prepare the national income and product accounts (NIPA) and quarterly gross domestic product (GDP) by industry statistics. In the NIPAs, the expense and revenue data currently collected are used to prepare quarterly estimates of personal consumption expenditure (PCE) for services and of software in private equipment and software. In the GDP by industry estimates, revenues are used to estimate gross output for taxable industries and expenses are used to estimate gross output for tax-exempt industries. A list of items used by BEA appears in the attached table.

Please keep BEA informed about any modifications to these forms. We are particularly interested in any modifications proposed during the forms' approval process that would substantially affect our use of these data.
