#### PART I.—GENERAL INFORMATION

**Background.** -- This proceeding was instituted in response to a petition filed on October 7, 2020, by Appvion Operations, Inc. (Appleton, Wisconsin) and Domtar Corporation (Fort Mill, South Carolina). Antidumping duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of these proceedings if the Commission makes an affirmative determination of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce ("Commerce") makes an affirmative determination of dumping. (In-scope) thermal paper covered by these investigations is thermal paper in the form of "jumbo rolls" and certain "converted rolls." Jumbo rolls are defined as rolls with a nominal width of 4.5 inches (11.43 centimeters) or more, a nominal weight of 65 pounds (29.4835 kg) or more, and a nominal diameter of 20 inches (50.8 centimeters) or more ("jumbo rolls"). All jumbo rolls are included in the scope regardless of the basis weight of the paper. Also included in the scope are "converted rolls" with a width of less than 4.5 inches (11.43 centimeters), and with a basis weight of 70 grams per square meter ("g/m²") or less. The scope covers jumbo rolls and converted rolls of thermal paper with or without a base coat (typically made of clay and/or latex, and/or like materials) on one or both sides; with thermal active coating(s) (typically made of sensitizer, dye, and co-reactant, and/or like materials) on one or both sides; with or without a top coat (typically made of pigments, polyvinyl alcohol, and/or like materials). The scope of these investigations covers imports of converted rolls from third countries that are manufactured from jumbo rolls produced in the subject countries.

Thermal paper is currently imported under statistical reporting numbers 4811.90.8030 (jumbo rolls) and 4811.90.9030 (converted rolls) of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS). The HTSUS provisions are for convenience and customs purposes; the written description of the scope is dispositive.

(Out-of-scope) thermal paper. -- Converted heavyweight thermal paper.

Note. — Unless specified, references to "thermal paper" refer to in-scope thermal paper only.

<u>Importer</u>.--Any person or firm engaged, either directly or through a parent company or subsidiary, in importing thermal paper (as defined above) into the United States from a foreign manufacturer or through its selling agent.

<u>Reporting of information.</u>— This questionnaire collects data regarding imports of thermal paper, both in jumbo roll form and converted, as well as lightweight and heavyweight.

"Lightweight" – Products with a basis weight of 70 g/m<sup>2</sup> or less

"Heavyweight" – Products with a basis weight of greater than 70 g/m<sup>2</sup>


Correcting valid number error messages.--If you are completing a Commission questionnaire in a country that uses periods (".") to delineate multiples of 1000 (e.g., one million would appear as \$1.000.000 instead of as \$1,000,000), you may be unable to enter in numbers greater than 999 in numeric form fields. This issues stem from your computer number formatting setting (e.g., not the MS Word document itself, but the computer from which you are opening up the document). Many EU countries use the reverse where multiples of 1000 are delineated with periods (.) and fractions less than one are delineated with commas (,). 
The solution to this data entry issue is to temporarily change your operating system's number formatting to be consistent with the U.S. number formatting system while you complete the questionnaire.

When you do this the number "twelve million dollars and thirty five cents" would change from \$12.000.000,35 (Italy format) to \$12,000,000.35 (U.S. format), and then there will be no conflict with the questionnaire. When you finish reporting the data then you can close the questionnaire and switch back to Italy settings.
