#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

**Background**.—This proceeding was instituted in response to a petition filed on June 30, 2021, by CF Industries Nitrogen, LLC; Terra Nitrogen, Limited Partnership; and Terra International (Oklahoma) LLC; Deerfield, Illinois. Countervailing and/or antidumping duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of these proceedings if the Commission makes an affirmative determination of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce ("Commerce") makes an affirmative determination of subsidization and/or dumping. <u>UAN</u> covered by these investigations is all mixtures of urea and ammonium nitrate in aqueous or ammonia solution, regardless of nitrogen concentration by weight, and regardless of the presence of additives, such as corrosion inhibiters and soluble micro or macronutrients.

UAN is currently imported under subheading 3102.80.00 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS). The HTSUS provisions are for convenience and customs purposes; the written description of the scope is dispositive.
