PART I.—GENERAL INFORMATION

Background. This proceeding was instituted in response to petitions filed on January 12, 2021, by Honeywell International, Inc., Charlotte, North Carolina. Antidumping and countervailing duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of these proceedings if the Commission makes an affirmative determination of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce ("Commerce") makes an affirmative determination of dumping and/or subsidization. Questionnaires and other information pertinent to this proceeding are available at: https://www.usitc.gov/investigations/2021/pentafluoroethane_r_125_china/final.htm.

<u>Pentafluoroethane ("R-125")</u> covered by these investigations is pentafluoroethane (R-125), or its chemical equivalent, regardless of form, type or purity level. R-125 has the Chemical Abstracts Service (CAS) registry number of 354-33-6 and the chemical formula C2HF5. R-125 is also referred to as Pentafluoroethane, Genetron HFC 125, Khladon 125, Suva 125, Freon 125, and Fc-125. R-125 that has been blended with other products is included within the scope if such blends contain 85% or more by volume R-125, on an actual percentage basis. However, R-125 incorporated into a blend that conforms to ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 34 is excluded from the scope of these investigations. When R-125 is blended with other products and otherwise falls under the scope of these investigations, only the R-125 component of the mixture is covered by the scope of these investigations.

Subject merchandise also includes purified and unpurified R-125 that is processed in a third country or otherwise outside the customs territory of the United States, including, but not limited to, purifying, blending, or any other processing that would not otherwise remove the merchandise from the scope of these investigations if performed in the country of manufacture of the in-scope R-125. The scope also includes R-125 that is commingled with R-125 from sources not subject to these investigations. Only the subject component of such commingled products is covered by the scope of these investigations.

Excluded from the scope is merchandise covered by the scope of the antidumping order on *Hydrofluorocarbon Blends from the People's Republic of China*, including merchandise subject to the affirmative anti-circumvention determination in *Hydrofluorocarbon Blends from the People's Republic of China: Affirmative Final Determination of Circumvention of the Antidumping Duty Order; Unfinished R-32/R-125 Blends*, 85 FR 15428 (March 18, 2020). See *Hydrofluorocarbon Blends from the People's Republic of China: Antidumping Duty Order*, 81 FR 55436 (August 19, 2016) (the Blends Order).

R-125 is entered under Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) statistical reporting numbers 2903.39.2035 and 2903.39.2938. Merchandise subject to the scope may also be entered under HTSUS statistical reporting numbers 2903.39.2045, 3824.78.0020, and 3824.78.0050. The HTSUS numbers and CAS registry number are provided for convenience and customs purposes. The written description of the scope of these investigations is dispositive.

<u>Covered blends</u>.-- Covered blends include any blends containing 85% or more by volume R-125, on an actual percentage basis. Blends that conform to ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 34 are excluded. Blends covered by the HFC blends order (i.e., R-404A, R-407A, R-407C, R-410A, and R-507A), as well as blends covered under the identified anticircumvention determination in the Blends order are also excluded.

<u>Reporting of information</u>.--If information is not readily available from your records, provide carefully prepared estimates. If your firm is completing more than one questionnaire (i.e., a producer, importer, purchaser and/or foreign producer questionnaire), you need not respond to duplicated questions.





When you do this the number "twelve million dollars and thirty five cents" would change from \$12.000.000,35 (Italy format) to \$12,000,000.35 (U.S. format), and then there will be no conflict with the USITC foreign producer questionnaire form. When you finish reporting the data then you can close the questionnaire and switch back to Italy settings.
