BEA's Use of EIA's Petroleum Marketing Survey Forms

Form	Items Used
EIA-14	Data from this form on composite (domestic and imported) acquisition cost per
	barrel of crude oil by refiners are used on a monthly basis to calculate a
	measure of price change for purchases of crude oil (information on crude oil
	prices from the Producer Price Index covers only domestically produced oil).
	This price index is used to deflate crude oil held in inventory by refiners for the
	change in private inventory component of gross domestic product (GDP).
	These data are also used for research and analyses (not current production) by
	BEA's Balance of Payments Division Research Branch.
EIA-782C	Data from this form on volumes of first sale of motor gasoline by grade are
	used to prepare estimates of the gasoline and oil component of personal
	consumption expenditures, PCE (a major component of GDP). The gallon
	sales by grade are used in constructing a weighted price per gallon which is
	then used to prepare estimates of real gasoline and oil expenditures.
EIA 856	Data from this form are used by BEA's Balance of Payments Division for the
	total crude oil import prices and quantities for BEA's goods projections for the
	advance estimate of GDP. The Bureau of Labor Statistics uses the EIA-856 to
	compute their crude oil price index which is also used by BEA's Balance of
	Payments Division.
