The Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) strongly supports the continued collection of data by the U.S. Census Bureau for the Current Population Survey -- Annual Social and Economic Supplement. The data collected on this survey are crucial to key components of BEA's economic statistics.

BEA uses data directly from this survey to prepare employment and compensation estimates for the national income and product accounts. The data are also used indirectly through a third party to estimate personal remittances in the international transactions accounts. A list of the data that are used is attached.

BEA will continue to review the data obtained through the survey for possible incorporation into our methodologies. Information on health care expenditures is particularly important as BEA further develops its health care satellite account in response to the growing economic importance of health care spending in the United States.
