PART I.—GENERAL INFORMATION

Background.--This proceeding was instituted in response to petitions filed on January 12, 2022, by Chemical Products Corporation ("CPC" or "Petitioner"), Cartersville, Georgia. Countervailing and antidumping duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of these proceedings if the Commission makes an affirmative determination of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce ("Commerce") makes an affirmative determination of subsidization and dumping. Questionnaires and other information pertinent to this proceeding are available at https://www.usitc.gov/investigations/701731/2022/barium_chloride_india/preliminary.htm.

Barium chloride covered by these investigations is barium chloride, a chemical compound having the formulas BaCl₂ or BaCl₂--2H₂O, currently classifiable under subheading 2827.39.4500 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS). Although the HTSUS subheading is provided for convenience and customs purposes, the written description of the scope of this order is dispositive.

Reporting of information.--If information is not readily available from your records, provide carefully prepared estimates. 


