## ATTACHMENT Items Used by BEA From A Guide to Reporting Highway Statistics

Form	Description of BEA's Use of
FHWA-531 State Highway Income	State motor vehicle, driver license, and motor carrier taxes and fees from Table MV-2 to estimate state personal taxes for the travel and tourism satellite account.
FHWA-539 Toll Facility Income and Expenditures	Expenses and receipts from Tables SF-3B, SF-4B, LGF-3B, and LGF-4B to estimate state and local government revenue and expenses, as well as gross output for state and local government enterprises in the benchmark input-output accounts.
Provided by the U.S. Department of Treasury	Receipts from Table FE-9 to estimate federal excise taxes by state to be included in gross state product.
