The Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe ("Tribe") is a federally recognized, sovereign Indian tribe and signatory to the Treaty of Point No Point of 1855, with reserved rights thereunder. The Tribe submits these comments in response to the request for public comment in the Federal Register issued by the Office of Child Support Enforcement ("OCSE") on December 6, 2021.

The Tribe supports OCSE's proposed changes to the OCSE-75 Form. Changes to the OCSE-75 Form will improve our ability to provide the information requested by OCSE so that we can better support our children and families.

The Tribe commends OCSE for integrating work groups that included tribal child support directors and OCSE staff in its process for amendments to the OCSE-75 Form.
