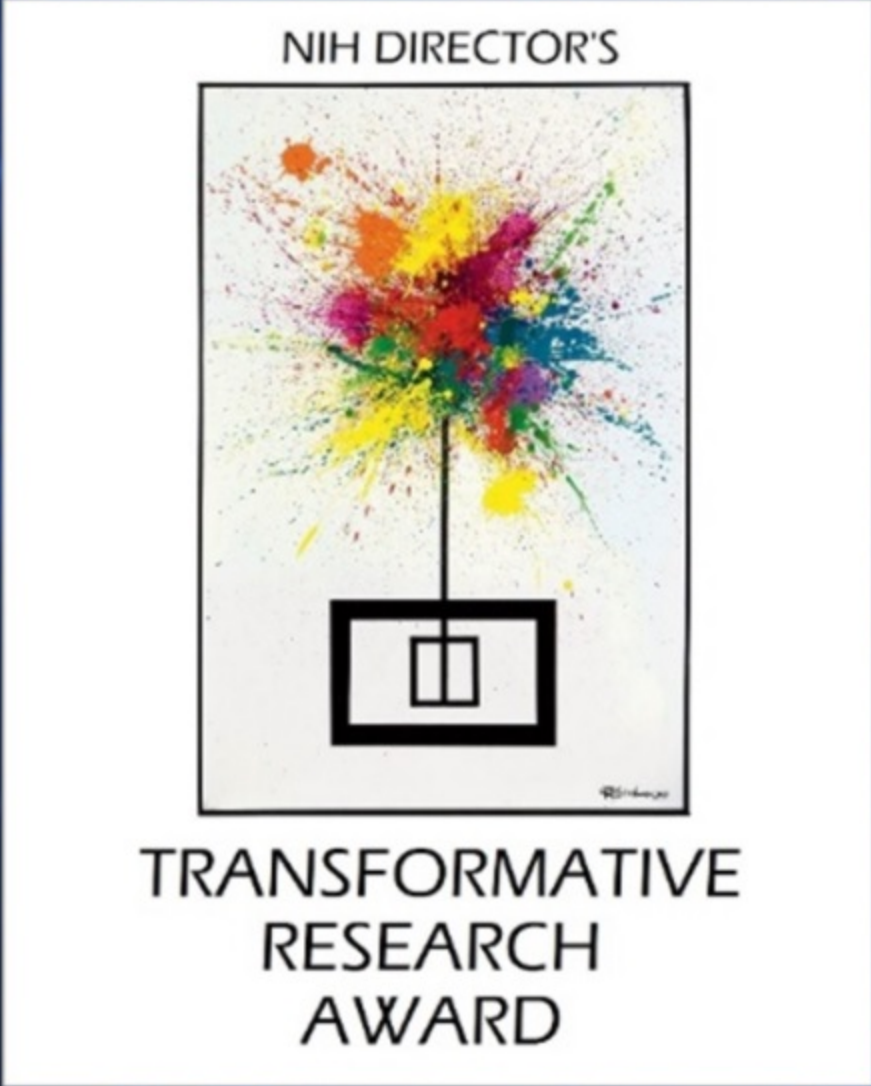
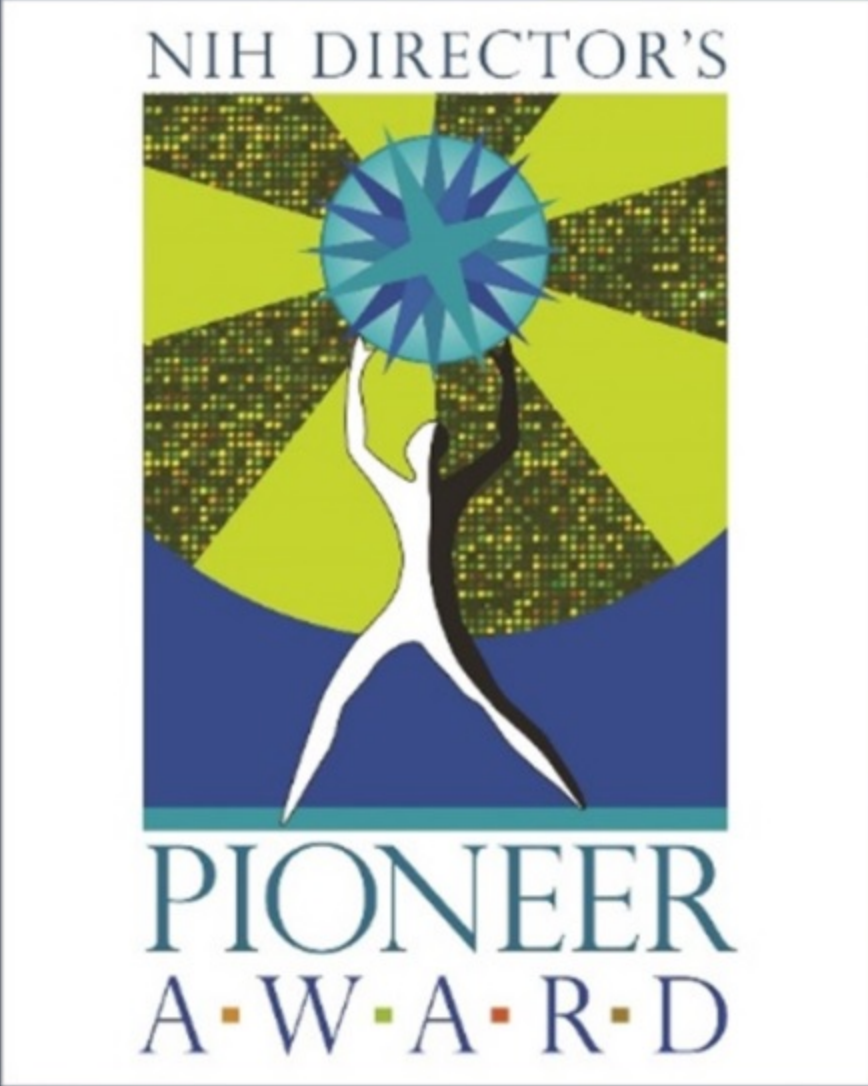


High-Risk, High-Reward Research Program



HRHR Seminar Series

The NIH High-Risk, High-Reward Research (HRHR) program is piloting a monthly seminar series with talks from HRHR awardees. The seminars will occur on the second Thursday of the month from 3:00-4:00 PM Eastern Time. Each seminar will feature two 15-minute presentations with a 5-minute Q&A. Networking opportunities will be available after the two presentations.

HRHR awardees are welcome, but not required, to participate. If you are interested in speaking at the seminar, please submit an abstract through this survey. Due to a limited number of seminar spots, not all submissions may be selected. Submitted abstracts will be reviewed by NIH staff and preference given to those near the end of their project period. Chosen speakers will be notified via email.

HRHR is unusual in the breadth of the science represented. Abstracts and presentations should be prepared with a broad audience in mind. Please prepare sufficient background and at such a level that non-experts in the field can readily understand the significance, innovation, and impact of the research.
