So, if you're sitting in the back seat, make sure you're safe in the back seat.




If you're in the back seat of a vehicle, unbuckled, and you get pulled over, you can plan on consequences.

If that happens, you're likely to suffer cuts, break bones in your face or something even more tragic.

So, if you're in the back seat and not wearing a seat belt, ask yourself, what's stopping you, the ticket or the injury? Either way, remember, there will be consequences.


