The U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) is renewing the Information Collection Request (ICR) titled, 1625-0065: "Offshore Supply Vessels – Title 46 CFR Subchapter L."

The purpose of the information collection is to promote the safe operation of vessels. The Coast Guard uses the information to determine if a vessel complies with certain safety and environmental protection standards. Plans and records for construction, modification or operation of vessels submitted and maintained on board are required for compliance with these standards.

There is no form associated with this collection.

The records contain basic business contact information, which may include the name and address of the vessel owner/operator, if owned/operated by an individual. Records associated with this collection are maintained in the vessel-specific file in the Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE) database.

Please describe rationale for privacy compliance determination above.

USCG is submitting this PTA Renewal to discuss the Offshore Supply Vessels information collection, which is used to aid in determining if a vessel complies with certain safety and environmental protection standards. The records contain basic business contact information, which may include the name and address of the vessel owner/operator, if owned/operated by an individual. No form is associated with this collection. Therefore, PRIV finds that no PAS is necessary.

PRIV concurs this information collection to be privacy sensitive, requiring PIA coverage. PIA coverage is provided by DHS/USCG/PIA-008 Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE), which is a steady-state system designed to capture information required to support the Coast Guard's marine safety, security, environmental protection and law enforcement programs. Supporting these programs requires the collection of personally identifiable information about individuals associated with vessels, as well as investigatory information.

SORN coverage is not necessary at this time, as information is not retrieved via unique identifier. However, this information is covered by DHS/USCG-013 Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE).
