The U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) is renewing the Information Collection Request (ICR) titled, 1625-0063: "Marine Occupational Health and Safety Standards for Benzene –46 CFR 197 Subpart C."

The purpose of this information collection is to protect individuals from exposure to toxic benzene vapor. The Coast Guard uses this information to determine if the proper safety precautions are being taken to protect the employees from hazards associated with the transfer and storage of benzene.

There is no form associated with this collection. The records contain the name, social security number, job classification and medical information of each employee subject to medical surveillance. The records also contain the name and address of the vessel owner/operator, if the vessel is owned or operated by an individual. A full list of requirements is in 46 CFR 197 Subpart C.

Benzene records are not submitted to the Coast Guard; rather they are developed and maintained by the employer. However, during non-standard practices such as marine casualty investigations, the Coast Guard could take possession of benzene records, store them in the Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE) system and retrieve the information by Coast Guard inspection or casualty case number.

USCG is submitting this PTA renewal for the Marine Occupational Health and Safety Standards for Benzene Information Collection, which is used to protect individuals from exposure to toxic benzene vapor. USCG uses this information to determine if the proper safety precautions are being taken to protect the employees from hazards associated with the transfer and storage of benzene.

There is no form associated with this collection. The records contain basic business contact information, which may include the name and address of the vessel owner/operator, if owned/operated by an individual. Additionally, the records include the name, SSN job classification and medical information of each employee subject to medical surveillance.

Additionally, benzene records are not submitted to the Coast Guard; rather they are developed and maintained by the employer. However, during non-standard practices such as a marine casualty investigation, USCG could take possession of benzene records, store them in the Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE) system and retrieve the information by Coast Guard inspection or casualty case number. Marine casualty investigations are covered by OMB Control Number 1625-0001.

DHS Privacy concurs that this information collection to be privacy sensitive requiring PIA coverage. PIA coverage is provided by DHS/USCG/PIA-008 Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE), which is a steady-state system designed to capture information required to support the Coast Guard's marine safety, security, environmental protection and law enforcement programs. Supporting these programs requires the collection of personally identifiable information about individuals associated with vessels, as well as investigatory information.

SORN coverage is not required at this time, as information is not recovered via unique identifier. However, SORN DHS/USCG-013 Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE) does provide coverage for this type of information collection.
