LPI Alvin Hicks The FCC proposes to exclude proposed collocations from historic preservation review by the UKB Tribal Historic Preservation Officer ("THPO") unless the THPO responds to a notice within thirty days. This proposal is unworkable. The THPO receives hundreds of notices each month and requiring a response within thirty days cannot be done without an infusion of resources, which the UKB does not have. The proposed change also violates the rights of the UKB and all Indian tribes to review collocations for potential impacts to sacred sites, cultural sites, and historic tribal properties. The UKB opposes this change and asks the FCC to withdraw the proposal.

Additionally, the FCC has completely failed in its duty to conduct consultation with the UKB and other affected Indian tribes. This duty is enshrined in Executive Order 13175 of November 6, 2000, which has been reinforced by President Biden's recent Memorandum on Uniform Standards for Tribal Consultation of November 30, 2022. Until the FCC fulfills its duty to consult in good faith with Indian tribes, the action proposed in its October 14, 2022 should not take effect.

I will be happy to attend a consultation with the FCC once one is scheduled.
