We highly encourage inclusion of one or more presenters or discussants who: (a) represent a developing country or low resource setting; (b) are a provider, individual with lived experience, advocate, or policymaker; or (c) represent the perspectives of an underserved community or population in a developing country or other low-resource setting.

Abstracts for symposia should include an overview that is no more than 200 words, and individual presentation descriptions should be no more than 100 words.
