





Idea 1 Eyes Forward


Strategic Territory: Name the Problem

















CHECK THIS OUT







End on black.

Camera pulls back to reveal black screen is a phone safely tucked in a purse, out of the way of distraction, and pulls out further to show a non-distracted driving.






