## Dear Ms. Rees:

On behalf of the American Society of Pediatric Nephrology (ASPN), I am writing regarding the proposed revisions to the CMS-2728 ESRD Medical Evidence Form. Founded in 1969, ASPN currently has over 700 members, making it the voice for pediatric kidney disease. Our members strive to ensure that affected infants, children, adolescents, and young adults receive appropriate and high-quality care.

ASPN has been in regular communication with the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and submitted formal comments about ways to improve the data collected about children with end-stage renal disease (ESRD). Children with ESRD are the only pediatric patients automatically eligible for Medicare coverage, and their care differs significantly from that delivered to adults. Despite these differences, their care needs and unique health conditions are not differentiated from those of adults by the Medicare reimbursement structure and the agency's data collection mechanism. As such, ASPN has urged CMS to begin collecting information on pediatric-specific comorbidities to reflect the care and resources being delivered to this population more accurately. Therefore, ASPN is pleased that CMS has proposed to update the CMS-2728 form to include pediatric-specific comorbidities and we urge the agency to finalize their addition to Section A #19 of the form.

Thank you for proposing these additions to ensure CMS' data more accurately describes the children with ESRD who are covered by Medicare and the opportunity to submit these comments.
