NEVER HAPPENS ALL THE TIME -: 30 TV

In this spot, we'll see all the examples of times when parents say they'll never allow something to happen, yet they always let it slide.

Open on an exhausted mom watching TV with her teething baby. We slowly pan out to reveal the baby isn't chewing on a teether - it's a dog toy.

VO: You say you'd never let them teethe on that.

We see an exhausted dad in a bathrobe put down a slice of cake in front of his daughter for breakfast.

VO: You say you'd never give them cake for breakfast.

We see a kid with their grandparents at a restaurant. The kid has messy hair, a food-stained shirt, and mismatched shoes sitting in a high chair.

VO: You say you'd never take them in public looking like a hot mess.

We cut to a dad walking away from a car, then turning back.

VO: You say you'd never leave them in a hot car.



GAINED ACCESS -: 15 TV

Open on a kid playing with sidewalk chalk next to a car in a driveway. We see the dad watching them, as his phone rings. He takes the call, and we see him turn his back and walk around while on the phone.

VO: You say you'd never let them out of your sight.

We see the kid start drawing on the tires with the chalk, leading up to the car door.

The kid opens the door.

VO: But never happens all the time.

We see the dad notice the kid and rush over to grab him, then he locks the door. As he turns around we pan out to see chalk all over the car, garage door, and on the family's white dog who's now rainbow colored.

SUPER: 1 in 4 Child Hot Car Deaths happen when kids gain access to

unlocked cars.

VO: Cars get hot fast. And kids can be at risk.

Cut to logo and end card.


SUPER: Never say never.

In this spot we cut to different parents in interview style set-ups, confessing to forgetful parenting moments

MOM: Well, August snuck up on us... and we forgot to take our child to

school.

DAD: On the FIRST DAY.

DAD: I forgot to build a bike for Christmas.

MOM: We forgot her first ballet recital.

You know who didn't? My mother-in-law.

SUPER: EVEN THE BEST PARENTS FORGET IMPORTANT THINGS

DAD: We forgot the 2-year-old check-up.

MOM: We?

We cut to a picture of her smiling kid, beet red.

GRANDPA:

Our daughter forgot to pack diapers
I'm still recovering.

We cut to the mom from Home Alone - Catherine O'Hara, in character, portraits of The McAllister family on the wall behind her.

MRS. MCALLISTER: I don't want to talk about it.

We see quick cuts of all the couples getting their kids out of the back seat.

VO: As parents, we know nothing's unforgettable—

over 50% of hot car deaths come from kids

forgotten in the car.

Quick cuts of parents checking the backseats, then locking their doors.

SUPER: Stop. Look. Lock.

GAINED ACCESS -: 15 TV

In this spot, we hear short confessionals from forgetful parents and reminders about gained access and leaving kids behind.

VO/SUPER: EVEN THE BEST PARENTS FORGET

IMPORTANT THINGS

MOM: I forgot some ballet practices (Laughs).

and her first recital.

SUPER/VO: 1 in 4 Child Hot Car Deaths are from gained

access.

VO: Never forget to lock up—even at home—

because kids get in, and can't always get out.

SUPER: Stop. Look. Lock.

NO SOUND? TURN AROUND. - :30 TV

In this spot, we remind parents that at home, silence demands immediate attention - then explain why it's even more important in the car.

We see a Dad at home prepping dinner. Behind him, there's the sound of kids playing and being rambunctious.

Suddenly the kids go silent - and the dad looks up, nervously.

DAD: Why is it quiet?

We hear Bonnie Tyler's chorus from Total Eclipse of the Heart.

SONG: "Turn around"

The dad turns around and sees his daughter elbow deep in a Costco-size peanut butter jar.

VO/SUPER: PARENTS ALREADY KNOW - NO SOUND? TURN AROUND

VO/SUPER: BUT DID YOU KNOW IT'S MORE IMPORTANT IN THE CAR?

We see a dad pulled up to a post office, looking at a sleeping child in the backseat.

DAD: I'll be so fast.

He cracks a window and gets out.

VO/SUPER: CARS GET HOT FAST—EVEN AT JUST 57 DEGREES

SONG: "Turn around"

He thinks better of it and grabs the kid, we see him in the post office, wrapping a package up as the child sleeps on him.

VO So when leaving the car, use silence as a warning.

Just like at home.

VO/SUPER: NO SOUND? TURN AROUND.

SONG: "Turn around"

GAINED ACCESS -: 15 TV

We see a Dad prepping dinner at home. Behind him, there's the sound of kids playing and being rambunctious.

Suddenly the kids go silent - and the dad looks up, nervously.

DAD: Why is it quiet?

VO/SUPER: EVEN AT HOME, KIDS WILL GET INTO THE CAR

SONG: "Turn around"

Dad turns around, checks the car in the garage, and finds his kids throwing glitter around the backseat

VO As a parent, silence is a warning.

Always check and lock your car to keep kids safe.

VO/SUPER: NO SOUND? TURN AROUND.

SONG: "Turn around"

SUPER: STOP. LOOK. LOCK
