On behalf of Mayo Clinic, thank you for the opportunity to share our comments regarding the proposed information collection for End State Renal Disease Death Notification, specifically the ESRD Death Notification form (CMS-2746) required to be completed by all Medicare-approved ESRD facilities upon the death of an ESRD patient.

Type of Information Collection Request: Reinstatement of a previously approved collection; Title of Information Collection: End Stage Renal Disease Death Notification; Use: The ESRD Death Notification form (CMS– 2746) is completed by all Medicare approved ESRD facilities upon death of an ESRD patient.

Mayo Clinic requests the ESRD Death Notification form allow the description of the Cause of Death, next to the code number in field 11. Since the forms are part of the patient's medical record and may be reviewed often, not all who review patient's medical records professionally are familiar with the cause of death codes. If the description is added to the form, facilities will gain efficiency through a reduction in effort required to search paperwork and crosswalks for code identification. In addition, we request the Cause of Renal Failure on the CMS 2728 Form, field 14 include a description for easier access. Although the form(s) may have each of these fields indicated and listed on the "back of form", each of these forms is generated electronically in the End Stage Renal Disease Quality Reporting System (EQRS) and neither of these generated forms includes an additional page with the codes and definitions. The additional pages are available from CMS, but they are not currently attached to the forms that are created, submitted, and scanned into the patient's electronic medical record. Conclusion
