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PART I.—GENERAL INFORMATION

Background.-- This proceeding was instituted in response to a petition filed on April 27, 2023, by Worthington Industries, Columbus, Ohio. Countervailing and/or antidumping duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of these proceedings if the Commission makes an affirmative determination of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce ("Commerce") makes an affirmative determination of subsidization and/or dumping. Questionnaires and other information pertinent to this proceeding are available at https://ids.usitc.gov/case/8125/investigation/8391.

NRSC covered by this proceeding are certain seamed (welded or brazed), non-refillable steel cylinders meeting the requirements of, or produced to meet the requirements of, U.S. Department of Transportation ("USDOT") Specifications 39, Transport Canada Specification 39M, or United Nations pressure receptacle standard ISO 11118 and otherwise meeting the description provided below ("non-refillable steel cylinders"). The subject non-refillable steel cylinders are portable and range from 100-cubic inch (1.6 liter) water capacity to 1,526-cubic inch (25 liter) water capacity. Subject non-refillable steel cylinders may be imported with or without a valve and/or pressure release device and are unfilled at the time of importation. Non-refillable steel cylinders filled with pressurized air otherwise meeting the physical description above are covered by these investigations.

Specifically excluded are seamless non-refillable steel cylinders.

NRSC are currently imported under statistical reporting numbers 7311.00.0060 and 7311.00.0090 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS). They may also be imported under HTSUS statistical reporting number 7310.29.0030 and 7310.29.0065. The HTSUS provisions are for convenience and customs purposes; the written description of the scope is dispositive.

<u>Purchaser</u>.--Any firm engaged, either directly or through a parent company or subsidiary, in purchasing NRSC from another firm that produces, imports, or otherwise distributes NRSC.

<u>India, subject.</u>--For purposes of reporting data to the Commission, data on "India, subject" should include all imports of NRSC from India excluding imports from Inox India Limited, in India. Commerce has preliminarily determined that imports from Inox India Limited are not sold at LTFV, and therefore are preliminarily classified as nonsubject. However, imports from Inox India Limited are still covered by these ongoing investigations, and at a later date may be classified by the Commission as subject, depending on Commerce's final determination as to sales at LTFV.

<u>India, nonsubject.</u>--For purposes of reporting data to the Commission, data on "India, nonsubject" should include only imports of NRSC from Inox India Limited, in India. Commerce has preliminarily determined that imports from Inox India Limited are not sold at LTFV, and therefore are preliminarily classified as nonsubject. However, imports from Inox India Limited are still covered by these ongoing investigations, and at a later date may be classified by the Commission as subject, depending on Commerce's final determination as to sales at LTFV.
