GENERAL INFORMATION

Background.-- This proceeding was instituted in response to petitions filed on February 14, 2024, by Cornerstone Chemical Company, Waggaman, Louisiana. Countervailing and/or antidumping duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of these proceedings if the Commission makes an affirmative determination of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce ("Commerce") makes an affirmative determination of subsidization and/or dumping. U.S. producers of melamine have provided the USITC with allegations about sales or revenue that they have lost due to competition from imports of melamine from Germany, India, Japan, Netherlands, Qatar, and/or Trinidad and Tobago. One or more domestic producer(s) have named your firm in such an allegation.

Melamine (Chemical Abstracts Service ("CAS") registry number 108-78-01, molecular formula C₃H₆N₆) covered by this proceeding is a crystalline powder or granule typically (but not exclusively) used to manufacture melamine formaldehyde resins. All melamine is covered by the scope of these investigations irrespective of purity, particle size, or physical form. Melamine that has been blended with other products is included within this scope when such blends include constituent parts that have been intermingled, but that have not been chemically reacted with each other to produce a different product. For such blends, only the melamine component of the mixture is covered by the scope of these investigations. Melamine that is otherwise subject to these investigations is not excluded when commingled with melamine from sources not subject to these investigations. Only the subject component of such commingled products is covered by the scope of these investigations.

Melamine is currently imported under statistical reporting number 2933.61.0000 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS). The HTSUS provisions and CAS registry number are for convenience and customs purposes; the written description of the scope is dispositive.
