Thank you for your email request for assistance with obtaining training and employment through programs administered by the U.S. Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration. Your email was forwarded to ETA's Office of Workforce Investment, Division of National Programs, Tools, and Technical Assistance, Older Worker Unit as it administers the Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP).

SCSEP's purpose is to serve unemployed individuals aged 55 or older who are unemployed, at or below 125% of the federal poverty level and not considered job ready. SCSEP participants are paid minimum wage while training for jobs through local community service organizations, hospitals, schools, and daycare centers. They are also eligible to participate in other training that allows participants to acquire the skills needed to compete in the current job market. For further information on training, you may contact your local employment office, AJC, or SCSEP grantee. To find a SCSEP provider in your area, you can go online to the America's Service Locator at www.servicelocator.org, or you can call the following Toll-Free Number: 1-877-US-2JOBS (1-877-872-5627).

Another viable option is the American Job Centers (AJC). AJCs provide access to programs and services that include financial aid assistance for training and education, career development and guidance, job search assistance, and unemployment insurance benefits. At the AJC in your area, you will find helpful professionals and easy to use information and resources to help guide your career development.
