First of all, the FBAR's extremely low \$10,000 filing threshold has been in place since 1970. It is overdue for an update to at the very least be indexed to inflation, which would be \$79,000 for 2024. Second, the FBAR is a massively complicated filing requirement that hasn't changed for over 50 year and is not in line with that Sweden or many other countries require of their expats.
