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Comment

I have a comment on the online N-600K form, section "Evidence", which contains an item called "Child's proof of lawful admission and maintenance of lawful status", with field type "Upload". It does not make sense to ask the applicant to upload this with the N-600K application, because the child is not required to be in the US at the time the N-600K is filed. The instruction text for this item says, "Form I-94, Arrival-Departure Record, is required, if available, at the time of interview for all children seeking citizenship under INA section 322." Since this is only required at the time of the interview, it should not be something that the applicant is asked to upload when filing the N-600K form. In fact, the paper version of the N-600K form, information about the child's admission to the US is asked in Part 15, "USCIS Officer" of the proposed N-600K paper form, which the form specifically says is not for the applicant to complete.

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
