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I agree that filing the FBAR from Abroad (in my case, Canada) is unnecessary, lacking in utility, burdensome, and stigmatizing, as stated in the Taxation Task Force's Response to Treasury Department's Comment Period on the FBAR. I have filed my US taxes for 30 years, and because the paperwork and the laws are so burdensome I need to hire an accountant, which costs about \$1,000 per year. That's \$30,000 better spent elsewhere. And it's not just the cost; it's the principle. Today, I filled out my 2023 FBAR, which contains banking information from the most basic type of banking that the average person engages in. There is no need for the US government to see any typical citizen's regular banking activity. This is not where money launderers go: to a chequing account at a local bank branch. Please consider what the Taxation Task Force is proposing. Please reduce, if not remove entirely, the burden of US citizens living abroad from filing taxes.
