Thank you for your comments regarding the Federal Register Notice in support of the three year extension to the Energy Information Administration's uranium survey program (*OMB No.*: 1905–0160).

The referenced chart that was presented at the NEI Fuel Supply Forum conference in July 2023 was EIA's attempt at providing our data in a new, different, and useful way and it seems to have hit the mark on those three points. EIA staff is always looking at ways to provide the data we collect in the most useful fashion. To that end, staff will investigate whether the referenced chart can be published on an annual basis in the Uranium Marketing Annual Report. This would involve IT support as changes will need to be made to our data aggregation and publication systems.

EIA staff will need to balance the amount and granularity of data released with survey respondent confidentiality protections. To that end, it may not be possible to include exact numbers or percentages in groupings or tables or to provide the data by material type as these disclosures may not pass EIA data confidentiality suppression screens. Data publication levels can also change year-to-year as data submissions fluctuate.
