#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

<u>Background</u>.--This proceeding was instituted in response to petitions filed on July 10, 2024, by Tungsten Parts Wyoming, Inc., Laramie, Wyoming. Countervailing and/or antidumping duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of this proceeding if the Commission makes an affirmative determination of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce ("Commerce") makes an affirmative determination of subsidization and/or dumping. <u>Tungsten shot.</u>-- The merchandise covered by the investigations is certain tungsten spheres or balls, also known as shot, that are 92.6 percent or greater tungsten by weight. In scope shot have a diameter ranging from 1.5 mm to 10.0 mm. Subject shot can be referred to as "Tungsten Super Shot." Merchandise is covered regardless of the combination of compounds that comprise the non-tungsten material and whether or not the tungsten shot is additionally coated with another material, including but not limited to copper, nickel, iron or metallic alloys.

Tungsten shot subject to the investigations is provided for in Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) subheading 8101.99.80. Merchandise may also be imported under HTS statistical reporting number 8482.91.0020 or subheading 9306.21.00. The HTSUS subheadings are provided for convenience and customs purposes only. The written description of the scope of the investigations is dispositive.
