Note: The reporting time frames for all information in the individual and family level module is based on the **federal fiscal year**, which runs from October 1 of a given calendar year until September 30 of the following calendar year.

The data collected in this module relates to **Goal 1: Individuals and families with** low incomes are stable and achieve economic security.

**Section A: Individual and Family Services** provides information on the work CSBG eligible entities did to help individuals and families achieve the outcomes listed in Section B. This standardized Individual and Family Services list will aid in analysis of the relationship between individuals, services, and outcomes.

**Section B: Individual and Family NPIs** is comprised of indicators to report outcomes that fall under National Goal 1: Individuals and families with low incomes are stable and achieve economic security.
