



The centerpiece of this scene is a car parked in a driveway. We view the life of a family as it happens in fast motion in and around a parked car.

The camera will zoom around the car and focus on certain scenes, slightly slowing the speed for a moment before racing onto the next milestone. The fashions and ages of the characters change as time progresses.

Start with a mom putting her child in a car seat in the back seat of the car.

FF- Mom hops in the driver's seat while dad hands their son in the back his pillow and blanket.

FF- The son gets into the driver's seat now, and dad is teaching him how to drive.

FF- Fully licensed, the grown son is opening the passenger door for his date.

FF- The parents hop in the car with their son in full graduation attire, looking excited.

FF- The father is helping the son load up the trunk as he is moving to college.

FF- Emergency workers surround the car – which now shows damage – and they are trying to extract the young man from the driver's seat.

VO- Life is fast, but speeding catches up with you.

#### Dog Walker

A young woman is walking her dog on the sidewalk while on her phone.

Man (driving): Hey yeah. I'll be there soon. About 10 minutes away.

Cut to gas pedal as he accelerates.

Cut back to man: Make it 8.

Cut back to the woman on the sidewalk. The scene around her freezes.

Woman on the phone (looks upset): Hey ma, just leaving you a quick message. I won't be stopping by tonight. (She starts to break down.) I'm so sorry.

She tries to walk, but we see she can't. Her feet won't move. She kneels and unleashes the dog.

Woman: Ok, boy, be good, go back to the house.

The dog scoots away hesitantly looking worried and confused. She stands up and turns. The man in the car has lost control, and the car is barreling down on her. She gets struck.

The logo comes up. We hear the dog barking and whimpering.







#### **Expect Delays**

Visual: A young man is in his car driving calmly when an alert sounds on his GPS.

Super: When it comes to speeding, there's no good ending.

**GPS Voice: Crash ahead, expect delays.** 

Then glances at the map to see his arrival time jump up dramatically. He becomes stressed and vocalizes frustration.

#### Driver: Guhhh. I'm going to be late!

He steps on the gas to try to make up time while he can. Eventually, he ends up in a wreck.

The camera pulls above the crash and begins to rise and rise. Slowly the scene turns into a digital graphic. From the graphic, we pull out from the GPS screen in his car... we are back where we started.

He gets the same alert on the GPS.

**GPS Voice: Crash ahead, expect delays.** 







# Intense Conversation (Social Norming)

A man and a woman enter an empty room consisting of nothing but two chairs facing each other. They sit down, and both appear very tense.

Logos come up on black screen



The ones who have been pulled over for speeding.


The ones who get points on their license.
