I'm not saying it was okay to give out OxyContin and roxycodones like skittles like prior to 2012-13. But to classify hydrocodone / acetaminophen and oxycodone/acetaminophen in that same class isn't right. Those medicines help people. And back to overdoses skyrocketing that is because you just took most people's lives away their normal lives their ability to be around family and enjoy their kids playing outside. And unfortunately some looked to the street since the DEA and healthcare system failed them and look what came out.. fentanyl laced medicines that look like hydrocodone. More of the people I know have died in the last 6-7 years from overdose than my previous 35 years alive. The DEA and health care system killed those friends and family. They were not drug addicts they were not heroin addicts they used prescribed medicines and usually just Vicodin to live without pain and you took that away and they got it off the streets and died taking 1 pill. A pill if was prescribed and not a fake! You could take 5-10 and still wouldn't die. It's disgusting how bad the health care system has become continues to do.
