The decision to require applicants to be categorized by the sex assigned to them at birth is discriminatory, unscientific, and a sign of government overreach. To begin with, this discriminates against people whose gender identity does not align with the sex assigned to them at birth - including people who are transgendered, non gendered, and intersex. There is no public safety interest that outweighs an individual's interest to self-determination, freedom of expression and speech, protection from possible unreasonable searches and denial of due process.
