I strongly oppose the proposed changes to passport forms DS-11, DS-82, and DS-5504 that would replace gender with "biological sex at birth." These changes serve no practical purpose in verifying identity and instead create unnecessary burdens for many individuals.

Passports and government identification documents exist to confirm a person's identity as they present in the real world. Border officials and security personnel rely on these documents to match individuals to their photos, not to verify medical history or chromosomes. Forcing individuals—especially transgender and nonbinary people—to carry passports that do not reflect their lived identity increases the risk of harassment, travel disruptions, and bureaucratic obstacles without improving security in any meaningful way.

This change is a solution in search of a problem. It does not enhance the accuracy of identification documents or serve a legitimate governmental interest. Instead, it undermines the ability of many Americans to travel safely and without unnecessary scrutiny. I urge the Department of State to reject this change and maintain passport policies that prioritize accuracy, practicality, and respect for all citizens.
