I am commenting to express my concern with changes surrounding the "defending women..." Executive order. Specifically, I am concerned with the risk of renewing passports at the expense of reverting changed gender markers which will impede the free travel and safety of thousands of citizens. I do not want to see personal choices of identity revoked in a way that will make the consistency of their physical documents vulnerable. This is not only undignified, but can also be dangerous.

On a more personal note, my husband who has a changed gender marker is concerned about potential difficulties of renewing important identifying documents.
