This revision to the DS-11 should not go through.

A revised DS-11 requesting the applicant's "biological sex at birth" to comply with E.O. 14168, "Defending Women from Gender Ideology Extremism and Restoring Biological Truth to the Federal Government," completely fails to recognize the existence of intersex people, individuals who are neither male or female. According to the Cleveland Clinic, an estimated 1 in 100 Americans are intersex, meaning that roughly 3.4 million Americans would be forced to lie on the DS-11, as they are not either male or female.

Furthermore, the workers at the airports validating that person and passport are (correct word) have inherent biases on how "male" and "female" people look, dress, and act, which could call into question the validity of their passport or identity.
