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It is known medically there are more than two sexes. Many cases exist in which phenotype and genotype contrast, such as Androgen Insensitivity Syndrome (AIS), Swyer Syndrome (Complete Gonadal Dysgenesis), XX Male Syndrome (De La Chapelle Syndrome), Turner Syndrome (Monosomy X or XO Syndrome), Klinefelter Syndrome (XXY, XXXY, etc.), and Chimerism or Mosaicism to name just a few. Genital presentation is considered one of the least determining factors in the expression of sex, yet is used most commonly by itself in the assignment of sex on birth certificates.
