Data corrections must be allowed on US Passports for both names, as there are many legal ways to change a name, and sex.

Passports must continue to allow for the X marker, allowing more than two sexes, as intersex people exist. Intersex people are those who do not fit into the binary of male & female. This is often NOT evident at birth, and may even be discovered well into adulthood, and thus ability to change sex markers on passports is a necessary option. In addition, due to mixed chromosomes/genitals/gonads, some will never fall into the binary. As many as 1 in 100 Americans are intersex (Cleveland Clinic, article 16324).
