The changes proposed regarding gender marker requirements should not be implemented as biological sex is more complex than just "M" or "F." There are dozens of variations in biological sex at birth, some which only become apparent later in life during puberty or with a chromosome test. These variations would limit individuals, who are otherwise completely eligible for US Passports, from updating or using their passports. People who appear as one sex but we're assigned something else at birth, for example an intersex person with advanced PCOS who has masculine physical characteristics but has "F" on their birth certificate, may be questioned or denied access to eligible services for looking different than expected. The denial of sex variation and insistence that there are only two sexes is biologically unfounded, even before including transgender people. Once transgender people and others who undergo hormone therapy or surgery to alter their gender presentation are brought into consideration, the consequences of mandating a two-sex binary established at birth become even more pronounced. People who have passports and are eligible for US passports will be denied access to passports which reflect their current appearance and sexual characteristics, which will lead to these persons being unable to use the services they are eligible for. These proposed changes should be denied in order to ensure equal rights to all US citizens.
