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1. These changes are against the law of God.

If you take a moment to look at Creation, you will notice that God has made no simple rules, no laws without exceptions. Biological sex is no different. If you took a basic biology class in college, you would learn about the many different ways God has created biological sex in human beings, including intersex human beings.
