The purpose of a passport is to function as a form of identification and confirmation of citizenship. This is done in a visual manner. Thus, there is no benefit to requiring that the sex listed on one's birth certificate be listed on a passport. The information holds no bearing on visually confirming one's identity matches that listed on the passport. Even with invasive, and likely unlawful, inspection of one's person, such information still could not necessarily be "confirmed".
