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This particular change is unfortunately not in line with actual science or biological truth. There are also a plethora of flaws that will cause issues for travellers as well as unnecessary burdens and costs to border forces.

First, ensure you review actual biological conditions against this. Intersex as well as various forms of chimerism related to chromones is well documented. Realistically, there are more intersex individuals than trans individuals who will be negatively impacted.

Second, several trans individuals have undergone gender affirming surgeries, which means besides their chromosomes, there would be little evidence to indicate that they were male or female. This again would create unnecessary burdens and costs to border protection forces. Considering the desire to cut unnecessary spending, this would balloon out into additional checks, inappropriate detention of individuals, lawsuits, and delays for "normal" travellers.

Third, passports are used for entry/exit into other countries who do understand science and the reality behind the complex nature of chromones, gender, sex, and unique scenarios such as intersex individuals. The US will no longer align with international partners which likely will reduce tourism, which is already happening due to a variety of concerns. While it may appear to impact a small number of travellers, supportive family members, friends, and other conscientious individuals will cancel plans to travel to the USA. As you may be aware, this is already happening for a number of reasons, including opinion based changes, rather than embracing actual biological reality of sex, gender, chromones, and other related conditions.

It would also be imperative to investigate the evidence related to how passport identification will help keep women safe. In reality, it is clear that there is no evidence or study to support this claim. Remember to check peer reviewed studies from reputable institutions.
